The RSVP is the 31st October.

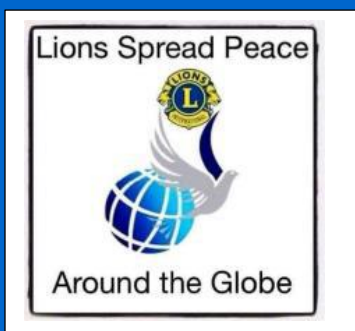
THE WORDS OF OUR FOUNDER, MELVIN JONES ...
